

How to Protect Your Seadek-

After installation, the preferred method of storage is that the boat (or any other surface of application) be covered. The SeaDek pads are very durable, but they will last longer and the colors will fade more slowly if they are not exposed to the elements when not in use. Examples include keeping the boat: in a garage, covered with a canvas boat cover, in a covered boat slip, etc...

Situations to Avoid:

Inflatable pool toys or water bottles stored long-term on SeaDek, or placing the SeaDek near reflective surfaces or beneath glass as detailed in Section II in the SeaDek warranty. These objects can refract/reflect light, thereby concentrating the beams to a level which can be destructive to the SeaDek pad.

Messes and spills on the SeaDek pad.

Some materials can stain the SeaDek pad if not promptly removed. Examples include: mustard, fish hooks left to rust, fish blood, bird droppings, etc.
